Healthy Living

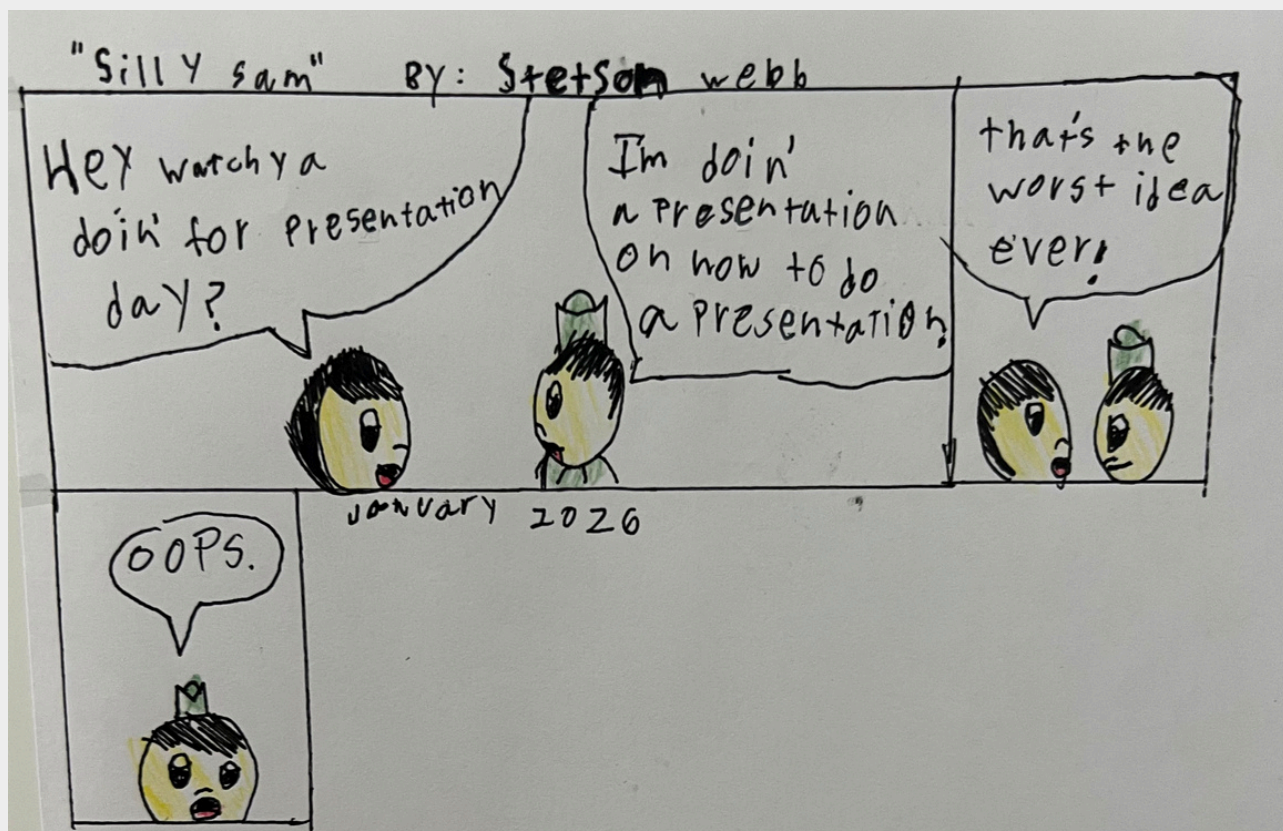
